

# Litany of the Departed

A. Arkhangel'sky

Thrice:

Lord, have mer-cy, Lord, have mer-cy, Lord, — have mer - cy.

Grant this, O Lord. Lord, — have mer - cy. A-men.

If covering the reading of names during the second petition,  
Slavonic can be sung in alternation with the English above:

Гос-по-ди, по-ми-луй, Гос-по-ди, по-ми-луй, Гос-по-ди, по-ми - луй.  
Gos-po-di, po-mi-luj, Gos-po-di, po-mi-luj, Gos-po-di, po-mi - luj.

По-дай, Гос - по-ди. Гос - по - ди, по - ми - луй. А - минь.  
Po - daj, Gos - po - di. Gos - po - di, po - mi - luj. A - min'.

In Ruthenian and Carpatho-Russian parishes, and OCA parishes of that ethnic background, at the **Litiya of the Departed** and at the **Graveside**, the Kontakion and Ikos of the Departed ('With the Saints') are sung immediately after the Litany of the Departed, before the Dismissal and Memory Eternal.
