

Litany of the Departed

Znamenny Chant
Tikhonovsky Variant,
after A. Arkhangelsky

Thrice:

Lord, have mer - cy, Lord, have mer - cy, Lord, have mer - cy.

Grant this, O Lord. Lord, have mer - cy. A - men.

If covering the reading of names during the second petition,
Slavonic can be sung in alternation with the English above:

Гос - по - ди, по - ми - луй, Гос - по - ди, по - ми - луй, Гос - по - ди, по - ми - луй.
Gos - po - di, po - mi - luj, Gos - po - di, po - mi - luj, Gos - po - di, po - mi - luj.

По - дай, Гос - по - ди. Гос - по - ди, по - ми - луй. А - минь.
Po - daj, Gos - po - di. Gos - po - di, po - mi - muj. A - min'.

In Ruthenian and Carpatho-Russian parishes, and OCA parishes of that ethnic background, at the **Litiya of the Departed** and at the **Graveside**, the Kontakion and Ikos of the Departed ('With the Saints') are sung immediately after the Litany of the Departed, before the Dismissal and Memory Eternal.
